



The role of the O&G SIG

- In our industry Information & Data (I&D)

Professionals working with information and data in the O&G supply chain.





AIIM CIP virtual study group








Why a virtual study group?

Provide a more thorough understanding of the topics the course material describes;



- Deeper, richer and wider engagement with content;
- Pacing ourselves through the course material;
- Different perspectives from group;
- Get to know other participants



How a CIP virtual study group works

- A virtual study group has 6 members, and the 6 modules are divided amongst the members;
- One member acts as facilitator / moderator;
- One module is discussed per meeting:
 - Everyone has studied the material and made notes;
 - The person who "owns" the module presents his notes (questions, ideas, comments, what does it means for their organisation etc.);
 - The group can share links to related material
- In the end everybody takes the exam!



What is required?

- Commitment that you will prepare "your" module;
- Commitment to participate in discussions;
- Attend every meeting (unless high urgency overrules);
- Connect Learn Share Have fun!



The moderator/facilitator has an important role:

- Get commitment from participants & line managers;
- Plan all the meetings;
- Moderate the discussions;
- Chase participants where needed on their actions



How to measure success?

To validate if this way of learning adds value, check:

- Did members pass the exam?
- Did the participants feel this way of studying adds value?
- Would participants recommend a study group to others?
